Affect & Scale


- Diffusion of responsibility

 Asynchronous / Synchronous and Passive / Active




- Trust is critical
 - Casual observations provide evidence of trustworthiness
 - Help someone feel a connection with you

- Environmental Controls
 - Is that a naked man in the background?
- Leadership
 - Unintended Consequences

Behavior & Environmental Controls



- Compliance Checks
- Accountability
- "Formal" controls
 - screen locks, anti-plagiarism checks, etc.
- "Informal" controls
 - Communicate expectations (Process and Product)
 - Give iterative feedback if possible (Rubrics and Collaborative Tools)
 - Level of Critical Thinking required

Behavior and Leadership

- What constitutes success?
 - Directive leadership
 - Important when tasks are ambiguous and followers' self-perceptions of abilities is low
- Expectancy Theory
 - I believe I can do the work
 - · My efforts will lead to goal attainment
 - I will earn a reward I actually value
- Path Goal Theory
 - Set and clarify meaningful and elevating goals
 - Remove obstacles to achieving those goals
